

About the MRPC

- The MRPC planning area consists of three cities, 19 towns and Devens. These
 communities are located in northern Worcester county and Middlesex
 county. The region's population is 242,671 (2020 Census) and our planning
 area encompasses approximately 685 square miles
- The MRPC is not a federal, state, or county agency but rather, it is a regional agency created by, and responsible to, its member communities
- MRPC has a staff of 11 full time professional planners and analysts in three departments
 - Planning and Development
 - Geographic Information Systems (GIS)
 - Transportation and Transit Planning

What the Plan Does

- Provides guidance to local and state officials in deciding how to spend federal and state transportation funds
- The Plan is <u>NOT</u> a wish list but a plan with recommended projects that have a reasonable chance of being funded

Why the Plan Matters

- It outlines transportation priority needs for the region
- If a community wants to receive funds for a project, it must fit into the policy goals of the Regional Transportation Plan
- The Plan is used to develop a list of projects that will receive state or federal funds.



What the Plan Covers

- Roads
- Rail
- Trails (bike and pedestrian)
- Transit (bus and paratransit)
- Freight/goods movement
- Safety
- Congestion (e.g. bottlenecks)
- Intelligent Transportation Sys (e.g. message boards on highways)
- Environmental concerns
- Regional growth
